We recognize that the need for affordable housing is complex, and in response, we are exploring innovative ways to provide homes to families. Our ability to offer more pathways to homeownership is also key. We are actively exploring other financing options, including utilizing our capacity as a Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) to further enhance our ability to help families achieve the dream of homeownership.

2. Fiscal Strength: Ensuring Long-Term Stability

Financial strength is the backbone of everything we do, and this year, we are focused on building a resilient foundation that will support our mission for years to come. We are setting a goal to build and maintain healthy operating reserves, ensuring that we have the resources necessary to weather challenges and grow our impact.

To get there, we are taking a thoughtful approach to our financial practices, including setting ambitious goals to grow our annual fundraising and increase ReStore revenue annually. This will enable us to expand our work and sustain our efforts as we move forward.

We're also making governance changes to better anticipate and mitigate risks. This includes developing a Risk Committee, charged with overseeing financial, reputational, and mission risks. Additionally, we are investing in our finance department by adding support and offering advanced fiscal training to our board and staff.

3. Growth and Impact: Delivering More Homes and Services

Our mission is rooted in the tangible impact we make in the lives of families. To do that, we are committed to increasing the number of families we assist in achieving homeownership in the years to come. This will be accomplished through a multi-pronged approach, including increasing home production, partnering with contractors, converting apartments into condos, and rehabbing existing homes in Dane County. Each method brings us closer to creating the affordable housing our community so desperately needs.

Our Home Repair program is also a vital part of our work. We aim to grow it annually to serve those who need it most – especially seniors.

4. People: Building a Thriving Organization

None of this would be possible without the incredible people who make up Habitat Dane—our dedicated staff, volunteers, and donors. We are committed to being a nonprofit of choice for those who want to make a difference in our community. This means recruiting and retaining top talent and providing clear paths for advancement.

My middle son is seven and also loves soccer. He's inspired by his older brother, and it's fun to watch them bond over their shared passion. My youngest son is five and has autism. He has a joyful love for music and jumping around, bringing so much energy and laughter to our days.

Our biggest life challenge came with the loss of my wife at the end of 2022. She was a true blessing to our family, and I know she would be overjoyed to see that our boys and I are now homeowners. Being a homeowner is a dream come true. We no longer have to move from place to place or worry about changing schools. With rent costs rising, having a place of our own, with enough rooms for the boys to grow and a yard where we can enjoy a swing set and invite friends over for dinner, brings a sense of stability that means the world to us.

I am so grateful to Habitat for Humanity for giving me not just the opportunity to own a home, but the confidence and the tools to truly thrive as a homeowner. This home represents a new chapter filled with hope, security, and a future full of possibilities for my family."

Transforming Dane County One Family at a Time

At Habitat for Humanity of Dane County, every volunteer hour and dollar donated goes directly towards delivering programs and services that make a difference right here in our community. Here's how:

Habitat Homebuilding

Habitat builds and rehabs safe, decent, and affordable homes with volunteer labor and donations of money and materials. Habitat sells the homes to partner families at market value, and homes are financed with affordable, zero-percent interest loans, with payments capped at 28% of the family's income.

Homeowners put in 425 hours (or 275 hours for a single-adult family) in sweat equity by building homes on the construction site, attending Habitat education classes, working at Habitat ReStore, and baking snacks for volunteers.

Habitat Home Repair

Through volunteer labor, Habitat is preserving homes and revitalizing neighborhoods, one home at a time. The Habitat Home Repair Program offers low-cost critical home repairs to income-qualified homeowners throughout Dane County.

Financial Capability

Habitat works hand-in-hand with families to improve their credit, budgeting, and financial health so they can become homeowners by qualifying for Habitat's homebuilding program or traditional financing outside the Habitat program.

► Habitat ReStore Furniture Bank

The Habitat ReStore Furniture Bank helps families in transitional housing receive the furniture they need to create comfortable, safe homes. Through partnerships with local social service agencies, the Habitat ReStore Furniture Bank supports families affected by poverty, domestic violence, homelessness, and other challenges, helping them build a fresh start.

Over its 23-year history, ReStore has generated \$7.3 million in net profits for Habitat's homebuilding mission, funding 81 Habitat homes for families in Dane County! This fiscal year alone, ReStore grossed \$2.5 million, contributing more than \$390,000 towards Habitat's mission.
